Cecilia Teresa Plascencia Gonzalez passed away peacefully in her home on April 18, 2022. She was born on November 27, 1958 to Maria de Los Angeles Gonzalez and George Danielsen in Tijuana Baja California, Mexico. Cecilia met and married Pedro Plascencia on February 13, 1982. Their marriage exemplified commitment to each other, perseverance and love. Pedro and Cecilia were inseparable, rarely doing anything without each other, even if that meant Pedro waiting hours in the parking lot of Cecilia's work so they could drive home together. Her greatest blessing and accomplishment were the birth of her children. Cecilia birthed three living children and was especially proud of her one angel in heaven who awaited her arrival and whom she was so proud to speak of.

Cecilia lived most of her life and raised her family in Southern California. After her kids graduated high school, she and her family relocated to Kaysville, Utah in 2003 where she resided for the remainder of her life. After getting settled in Utah, Cecilia started working for Salt Lake County and then transitioned over to working for the City of South Salt Lake, ending her career working in records with the Police Department.
