She considered her most important and sacred teaching role was that in the home as a mother and grandmother.

Fran loved nature and the outdoors. She found ways to couple this love with her teaching abilities. She helped create and develop many programs at the Alpine School District Clear Creek Camp and as a pioneer at the LDS Heber Valley Girls Camp. Fran created Botany, Geology, and History programs. With a fun and witty way that only Fran could make happen, she brought these programs to life and they are implemented and affecting the lives of thousands still today. You're welcome world.

Fran was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She enjoyed the scriptures and studying about different topics. She magnified each calling that she served in including, Young Women Presidency, Primary Presidency, Boy Scouts, Sunday School teacher and Relief Society.
