Frank was a Korean War Veteran having served as an Army Sergeant from 1950-1953.

He retired after 30 years of dedicated work, and was then able to spend time doing some things that he really enjoyed: reading, which he loved, fishing with his sons and son-in-law, watching sports on TV, especially football and basketball, and getting some exercise, which he always felt was very important.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Joanne, his parents, his brothers Albert, Max, Elmo, & Keith, and his sister Faye Brooks.

He is survived by daughter Patricia Allman (Norman), sons Frank J (Rene), David (Janice), Rick (Susan), Brad (Vickie), Jeff (Brenda), Jason (Tammy), and daughter-in-law
