1951-2016

Husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend Glenn R Martin, slipped from mortality to immortality on January 28, 2016 surrounded by his loving wife and family. He joins his deceased parents, grandparents, brother and other loving relatives who have prepared a place for him in paradise. He was an engaged father and took pride in watching his children grow, develop, complete college degrees, marry, and start families. He was proud that his children have made significant contributions to their communities and to the LDS church. His wife and family along with the 26 grandchildren stand as his crowning glory and as a true memorial to his good name.

Glenn was born on October 2, 1951, to Rueben Martin and Joyce Marie Brady in Salt Lake City, Utah. He was the second of three children. He lived in Hunter, Utah with his parents until tragedy struck and took the life of his young father. Joyce remarried William "Bill" Turnbow in 1956 and they moved the family to Murray, Utah, where he was raised with now seven siblings and educated in the public school system. Upon graduating from Murray High School in 1970, he attended Brigham Young University (BYU) on a scholarship where he enjoyed a year of growth, both educationally and socially. He was a member of the Young Ambassadors and travelled to the Northwest and Canada that year performing in venues in many cities. He was called to serve in the Andes Peru Mission in 1971 and it was there that he met his future wife, Carol Anne Woolley of Taylorsville, Utah, one of the first health missionaries the Church sent out. Upon returning from a successful mission in Peru, he re-entered BYU to pursue his studies in 1973. In the spring of 1974 he married Carol in the Salt Lake Temple and moved her to Provo where she worked at Utah Valley Hospital while he continued his studies. He eventually graduated with two degrees from BYU in education and taught at Dixon Middle School in the Provo School District for 11 years. He then pursued an administrative degree and worked in the Alpine School District for an additional 20 years as an Assistant Principal at Orem Jr. High and as the Principal of Seego Lily Elementary in Lehi and Saratoga Shores Elementary in Saratoga. His profession was a joy and blessing for him as he interacted with thousands of young

people along with wonderfully committed and caring educators over the 31 years. In 2011 he retired and spent his time and energy serving his growing family and managing liver cancer and liver failure under the gentle and loving care of his nurse wife, Carol and his five nurse daughters.

He loved cooking, music, dancing, attending theatrical performances and traveling. He and Carol travelled together to Mexico, Israel, Egypt, and China and created wonderful memories and saw some incredible sights of the world. The family became expert travelers together as they vacationed every summer in a pop up tent and fifteen passenger van. They visited historic church sites and cities from New York to Los Angeles, Vancouver Island to Dallas Texas. They went on a cruise to the Bahamas and loved visiting sites in Washington DC and the mid-west.

Glenn loved to serve others and served in many capacities both in professional organizations and in the Church. He served as a classroom instructor, Cub Scout leader, quorum leader, various stake callings, counselor, music director in the Primary and Ward Choir, and the sacred calling as Bishop of the Cascade 1st Ward for nearly six years.

He is survived by his wonderful wife, Carol, eight wonderful children and their spouses; Jill (Brian) Hall, Cameron (Rachel) Martin, Michelle (Andrew) Cardon, AnneJeanette (Jean-Pierre) Levesque, Dyana (Brett) Valdez, Russell (Nicole) Martin, Christina (Cameron) Boyle, and Chelsea (Darren) Peterson along with 26 grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, grandparents and one brother (Lynn). He is survived by his step-father Bill Turnbow, sisters Susan Ledkins, Kelli Cosby, Leslee LaMadrid, Rene Jamison, Valeree Nielsen and his wonderful in-laws, W. Grant and Clarice Woolley of Taylorsville. A celebration of Glenn's life will be held at 12:00p.m. Saturday, February 6, 2016 in the Orem Cascade Stake Center (481 East Center Street, Orem UT) with a viewing from 11:00a.m. to 11:45a.m. There will also be a viewing the evening prior, Friday, February 5, 2016 from 6:00p.m. to 8:00p.m. in the Orem Cascade Stake Center (481 East Center Street, Orem UT). Interment will be at Valley View Memorial Park in West Valley, Utah.

Memories of Mr. Martin

I had the privilege of meeting and working with Glenn Martin during all of his tenure at Segó Lily Elementary School. I interacted with him on many occasions in my roles as a concerned parent; parent volunteer; and lastly as an employee at Segó Lily Elementary. Below are some of the great memories I had of your husband, father, and grandfather.

Mr. Martin brought many positive changes to our school environment by applying for and receiving several grants to update and facilitate a physical environment which was more conducive to learning.

When our family was going through a crisis and it necessitated me to get a full-time job, I asked Glenn if he would write me a job recommendation. He was very good with words and the written language and wrote a recommendation that made me cry. He put great thought and care into this recommendation and I felt it truly depicted the things I lived for. I can remember commenting to him that not only would I be glad to give this recommendation to a potential employer, but that whenever I was discouraged--his words would bring me great comfort and hope.

He encouraged and motivated people to move forward in a positive direction with

their lives.

My three children not only knew that Mr. Martin was their Principal but they also considered him as their friend. They said they were thankful that Mr. Martin knew them individually and recognized them personally.

A great highlight to the audience (both young and old) was when Mr. Martin performed the "Rubber Ducky" song donning his blue house coat, shower cap, slippers. and holding a rubber ducky in his hand.

I heard Mr. Martin positively comment several times about his family: his wife Carol that was a nurse and his children that were working on, or had completed their college degrees.

He was a man of integrity. I can remember on one occasion Mr. Martin commenting that the doctor said he had the liver as one who was an alcoholic. Mr. Martin told me that he had never even tasted alcohol or smoked.

I remember one of the last things Mr. Martin said to me before he left to be a Principal at Saratoga Shores Elementary, "One of the things I am sad about is that I am not going to be here long enough to see Danny (the last of your three children) graduate from Segoe Lily.

I hope these memories of him will bring you comfort in your time of need just as the recommendation he wrote to me, several years ago, continues to offer me hope and encouragement.

Thanks so much for supporting and sharing your Husband, Dad, and Grandpa with so many people.
