He and I met shortly after my family moved to Tremonton, Fall, 1961. We were soon best friends (e.g. baseball, he caught and I pitched). My family moved from Tremonton to Star Valley, Wyoming, in the Summer, 1964. The following summer Perry and I worked together in the Teton National Forest near Jackson Hole Wyoming. Perry was always thirsty for pop and I occasionally tried to satisfy his thirst (only Perry will know that story). Our paths separated when I was married in 1966. However, they crossed again in about 1980 when the Crozier family moved to New Jersey for a short stay (my family and I had arrived there in 1976; some of us are still here). Our paths haven't intersected since and so I will have to wait for Paradise to renew our friendship.
