Robert Uga Alo, age 38, passed away on February 28, 2019, in Sandy, Utah. He was born on April 21, 1980, in Ogden, Utah to Falepule and Dottie Alo.

Robert Uga graduated from Horizonte High in Salt Lake City, Utah, in 1998. Later he graduated with an Associate's Degree in Graphic Design, 2011 from Provo College. He lived in Utah, California, Nevada, and Louisiana. He was employed as a heavy machine operator for 15 years, but during that time he would dive into his favorite hobbies designing websites, t-shirts and logos. When he was only 8 years old he taught his own class of young students. He was a lifelong member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He served as an Elder's Quorum Teacher. He was endowed in the Jordan River Temple.

There was never a time, Robert was not helping someone. Even when he had nothing, he would find some way to help. His love for his family was unbreakable, whether it was buying whoppers at Burger King or playing chauffeur for the day or running errands for his mom and dad. He did what he could. He was passionately driven and wanted to provide for everyone around him. He was always quick to forgive.
