She was raised by her birth parents, as well as her aunt and uncle, Carmín and Clemente Albello. She married Carmelo F. Castro in October 1975, and got divorced 9 years later.

She was a wonderful mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend to all of us. She was often referred to as the sweet little lady by those that met her, even if for a few minutes. She was a very positive person, who regardless of what life might have thrown at her, lived her life with the motto " La vida es bonita", Life is beautiful. We believe it is that motto that got her through the many hardships she encountered in her life. Everyone that met her, considered her very wise, and would cherish getting advice from her on many topics. She was an example of strength to all that met her. She was very independent and resilient. She raised her two daughters on her own, without ever complaining about it being difficult or hard. She battled Stage 4 breast cancer for 10 years without complaining. If you asked her if she was not feeling well, or if she was in pain, the answer always was I am doing well. Even on her last days, when we knew she was in pain, that was her answer. She never let cancer get her down, and proved that a positive attitude sometimes can make doctors liars. Her will to live was stronger than the cancer ailing her. She was a very spiritual lady, who enjoyed going to church and studying the scriptures. She was a pioneer in Puerto Rico, as one of the first to be baptized as a member of the LDS church. Through the years, she always was willing to serve others, and always left a little bit of herself with everyone she met. She surely will be missed by all that met her one way or another. Her siblings adored her and she was the favorite aunt of pretty much all her nieces and nephews. She became an instant friend to those she met and was able to keep those friendships alive throughout the years, regardless of distance or time.

She was very accomplished on all that she set herself to do. She got a degree from the University of Puerto Rico as a Legal Secretary, after graduating from High School with the equivalent of an associates degree as a secretary. She then proceed to get a job in the

Puerto Rico Justice Department as a Court transcriptionist. She went and bought herself a brand new Volvo she was very proud of, after getting her court job, even when she still did not have a driver license yet. She was a hard worker, and excelled as a legal secretary, as well as a transcriptionist on all the jobs she had. She loved learning. She took courses and classes of cooking, crafting, decorating, and even hypnotism throughout her life. She had a love for reading, and her bookshelves were always filled to the brim with books. She passed that love for learning and reading to her daughters, and still in them the desire to always do their best on everything. She loved poems and music, and enjoy going on walks, to look at flowers and listen to the birds sing. She loved going to the stores and window shop. And she loved decorating and was always ahead on trends. If she could she would had pursued decorating as a career. She was very poised and elegant and a fashionista since an early age. She learned to sew and would make herself dresses and clothes to keep up with the trends, and once she had kids, she used her sewing skills to make beautiful dresses for her daughters to go to church and for special occasions.

She was a great mom and an even greater Abuela. She sacrifice herself, to give her daughters everything they needed. Her love for her grandkids was immeasurable. It was a joy seeing her with her grandkids. She loved spending time with them. Singing, playing and reading to them, and spoiling them with regalitos. She was their Abu, who they loved, and miss already so much. She left a legacy of love and positivism which will be hard to duplicate!
