Vivian and Max loved to travel to Bermuda, Hawaii, and all over the US visiting their family. They enjoyed cruising, especially with their children, grandchildren, and great-children. They created many memories that their posterity all cherish.

Upon Max's retirement from fifty-one years at Cedar Park Cemetery in 1998, Max and Vivian moved to Laguna Niguel, CA to live with their eldest daughter Linda and her husband Rainer. They fell in love with the amazing weather and beauty of Southern California. Upon Max's death in 1999, Vivian once again worked as a volunteer at the Mission Regional Trauma Center. In 2015, due to failing health, Vivian moved to Assisted Living of Draper to be near her third daughter, Pam. She was treated like a queen and reigned supreme. Vivian was a little lady, but large in life. She was all about family and there was plenty of it in the area – many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She supported them all at school and sporting events and ballet recitals. She remained sharp until the end and maintained her great sense of humor. She will be missed greatly.
