Mom Ara Kisis Haddock passed away September 4, 2023 at the age of 85.

She was born December 12, 1937 in Limbaži Latvia. In 1943 she had to flee Latvia with her family ahead of a Russian invasion. She lived several years in a displaced persons camp in Germany until Klamath Lutheran church in Oregon sponsored them to come to the United States in 1950. She graduated from Klamath Union High School in 1957. She met and married Harold Austin Haddock in February 1959. They traveled the world together while he was in the United States Air Force. They settled in Clearfield Utah after he was discharged. She loved gardening, and spending as much time as possible in her yard. She also enjoyed cross-stitching, and quilting. She worked for TRW/Northrop Grumman for 28 years. They adopted a daughter, Sandra Dee Haddock (Cramer), and a son, Gary Lee Haddock.

She is survived by her children: Sandra (David), and Gary; six grandchildren: Danielle, Josh, Thomas, Kylee, Shanda and Austin; and three great grandchildren: Helen, Colton and Hannah.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Mary and Voldermars Kisis, brother Ike, sister Daila, and her husband Harold.
