Barbara Anne Bibee Olsen, 83, returned to her heavenly home on August 14, 2020, surrounded by family at Heritage Place in Bountiful, Utah. Born January 14, 1937, she was the third and youngest daughter born to Charles Gladwin Bibee and Veteres Marie Rosquist in Salt Lake City, Utah.

After graduating from East High School, Barbara worked as a secretary typing mission calls under the direction of Elder Gordon B. Hinckley at the office buildings of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She was sealed in the Salt Lake Temple to Gordon Clifford Olsen in 1958.

Barbara was a gifted seamstress who lovingly made wedding dresses for her daughters and sewed many other projects. She was a diligent indexer of historical records and helped many others navigate the process as a church service missionary. She loved nachos and would often ask her grandchildren to keep her well stocked to make them.

She is preceded in death by her parents, her sisters Colleen and June, her son Scott, and her great-granddaughter Audrey.

She is survived by her children Diane (Tom) Naylor, Adriene (Gregg) Murray, Eric (Angie) Olsen, and Annemarie (John) Williams. "Grandma Barb" will be dearly missed by 19 grandchildren and 20 great-grandchildren.
