Betty Eileen Bradley peacefully passed away on September 13, 2022, listening to her favorite music (Johnny Mathis, The Brothers Four and beautiful Paul Cardall piano music) with her husband Jim and her daughter Dianne by her side. She was fortunate to pass in her little basement apartment where she and her husband Jim had lived for over 6 years. She was just 4 days short of her 88th birthday.

Betty was born on September 17, 1934, into a faithful Latter-day Saint family in Fort Macleod, Alberta, Canada. Her parents, Edward Owen Dickie and Mary Victoria Thelin Dickie, were long-time residents of Fort Macleod. When she was young, Betty was a very fast runner and loved running. She was loved by everyone because of her loyalty, sensitivity, kindness, and her great sense of humor. One of her favorite pastimes was grabbing a friend or sister and going dancing at the dance hall in Waterton. She also loved reading and had a great love for animals—cats, dogs, and any other critters.

Betty married James Bradley, a handsome member of the Royal Canadian

Mounted Police, in Fort Macleod in March of 1955. Betty was always a great support to her husband Jim as they moved around and lived in Fort Macleod, Pincher Creek, Edmonton, and Lethbridge (all in Alberta Canada), before a career change took them to College Station Texas in 1966. Betty's career was in finance, working at various banks in Canada. After moving to College Station, she worked for 27 years as a bookkeeper/accountant in the food services department at Texas A&M University. Her biggest accomplishment and the joy of her life was being a mother and devoting her time to raising her three children Geraldine (Geri), Dianne (Di) and Shoryu (Jim). She also lovingly played a large part in raising her granddaughter Melanie and great-granddaughter Ashlynn.

Betty is survived by her husband James Bradley; daughter Dianne Nilsson (Jeff); son Shoryu Bradley; granddaughters Melanie Person (Byron), Jessica Muelleck (Nik), Whitney Marcum (Matt) and Jillian Miles (Mike); great-grandchildren Ashlynn Ford Haynes (Quin), Brooklynn Person, Kaidynn Person, Kate Muelleck, Bradley Muelleck, Andrew Muelleck, Ryan Muelleck, Oliver Marcum, Rose Marcum, Anders Marcum, Remi Miles and Peter Miles; great-great-grandson Zalen Haynes; brothers Edward Dickie (Marilyn) and Andrew Dickie (Fran); and sisters Linda Woods (Ron) and Dallene Foss (Scott).
