Cameron F. Hawe passed away peacefully at home in Sandy, Utah on Sunday, December 4, 2022 after a short illness.

Born January 14, 1939 to Floyd and Rosalie Brinkoff Hawe in Southern California. Cameron served 3 years in the Army, 4 years in the Air Force and retired from the Navy after a combined 20 years of service. He served in several foreign countries while in the service, including a year in Iceland. He lived in various cities in Southern California; Tijuana, Mexico; various cities in Southwestern Idaho; and St. George, Utah before moving to Sandy. It was in Boise, Idaho that Cameron met and married Janena Olsen in January 2001. Post military, Cameron chose various driving jobs & became a substitute teacher in St. George. He was a friend of Bill W. and completed 49 years of sobriety on October 28, 2022.
