Carlos was born January 25, 1935 in San Diego, CA to Howard and Lupe Fackrell. He was one of eight children. Carlos attended grammar and secondary schools in San Diego and went on to attend college. He played football for Cal Berkley and then attended BYU where he met his wife, Linda, in a dance class.

Carlos married Linda in 1961, they remained married and in love until her passing in 2010. Together they begat 10 children; Carlos D, Samuel, Whitney, Derek, Joey, Philip(Rhys), Maxcy, Ashley, Cassidy and Colby. Carlos has 42 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

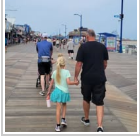
