



Cheryl Stone

August 1, 1938 - May 9, 2015

Our beloved Mother and friend Cheryl Stone returned home to her Father in Heaven on May 9th 2015. Complications related to pneumonia led to her unforeseen and sudden passing. We celebrate her life which was filled with music, family, and love and will cherish her memory throughout our lives.

Cheryl was born August 1st, 1938 in Brigham City, Utah to Joseph Oleen and Velda Young Palmer as the eldest of 6 children. As a youth she attended Box Elder High School, graduating in 1956 and later attended Utah State University. Cheryl received many awards and talent honors for her beauty and angelic voice. She was crowned Miss Utah National Guard and Miss Utah State in 1957 which allowed her to travel to Washington D.C. representing Utah.

While at Utah State, she met the love of her life, LeRoi Harold Stone and they were married on September 25th 1958. The newlyweds moved to Pocatello where their first two children Tana and Tori were born. Soon after, Cheryl and Roi moved to Milwaukee, Wisconsin for three years while Dad pursued his career. In 1965, they moved to what would be their lifelong home in Bountiful, Utah. They were blessed with two more children Roi Jr. and Tara.

Cheryl's love for music was apparent to all who knew her. She was an accomplished performance vocalist, and was classically trained by prominent professors of music at USU and the UofU. She both performed in and directed numerous musicals, and was the music director and chorister for the dedication of the Bountiful, Utah LDS temple. She was a member and past

chapter president of The National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS). Her greatest joy was realized in sharing her knowledge with her students as a private voice instructor for over 45 years. She touched the lives of her hundreds of students over that span, teaching them both vocal technique as well as life lessons. Many students have credited Cheryl with instilling in them the confidence and work ethic necessary to reach their personal goals in life. Her artistic legacy will carry on in the many songs yet to be sung by voices she has helped shape.

Cheryl was a lifelong member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. She served in many callings, including 25 years as choir director and 11 years as a gospel doctrine instructor. Perhaps her greatest calling was being a missionary to her dear husband, Roi, who joined the church in May of 2013.

Cheryl is survived by her children Tana Lee (Douglas) Stowell, Tori Lyn (Wally) Beck, LeRoi Palmer (Kerri) Stone, Tara Jo (Jonathan) Elggren, her siblings Linda (Ron) Mortensen, Rita (Gary dec.) Smith, LeRoy (Alene) Palmer, and Jeanette (Larry) Benson, 15 grandchildren and 6 great-grandchildren.

She is preceded in death by her parents, Joseph Oleen and Velda Young Palmer, husband LeRoi Harold Stone, and her brother Joel (Linda) Palmer.

“ I recognized Cheryl immediately from her Utah State picture. I'm sorry to hear of her sudden passing. I'm sure that she will be missed greatly by her friends and family. It was a good idea to use that USU pictures, because many students from that period will remember her.

Actually I was not acquainted with Cheryl and I doubt we ever exchanged a word, but I was very much aware of her because she was so striking when she came to USU and we were all awed by her beauty and demeanor-something to behold, somewhat of a "goddess" and seemed to be quite reserved.

I knew LeRoi as he lived in the basement of Melartin's home and my roommates and I lived in the upstairs apartment. We were friendly with him and his roommate. I even treated him and his roommate to a steak dinner once as my mom had given me steaks from our locker (freezer). Wouldn't you know my family (from Coalville) came to visit us that very day and saw me through the basement window at the dinner!

When Cheryl arrived at USU, I'm sure many young men were interested in her, but LeRoi let no grass grow under his feet and within a short time, they were dating. One day we went downstairs to the drive way and she was sitting in the car "looking like a princess" (as described by my roommate) while Le Roi went into his apartment.

Her hair was so beautiful and as I recall she had it cut during the year and although it was very attractive, she lost some of her original unique look. I had no idea she had a beautiful singing voice and wish I could have heard her sing. I married in January of 1958 left USU.

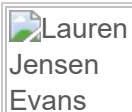
“ Dear Tara, Jay, and cute grandkids,
