



## Dr Tyler Seanoa Taumoli

Dr. Tyler Seanoa Taumoli, 47, passed away unexpectedly from a medical issue, resulting in a car accident near his office the morning of October 17th, 2023. A loving husband, son, brother and uncle, Tyler uplifted everyone around him with his amazing smile, laughter and love. A gifted healer and friend, Tyler had an ability to just make everyone feel special. Simply put, he was the best of us.

Tyler was born on July 22, 1976 in Calgary, Alberta, Canada. He lived his childhood years in Richmond, British Columbia. Tyler earned a college scholarship playing basketball, served an LDS mission in California, and then moved to Utah to continue his education. He completed his degree in Exercise Sports Science at the University of Utah and then graduated from Parker University with a Doctorate in Chiropractic. After gaining chiropractic experience working in Texas and Utah, he established Utah ChiroSport in West Jordan, Utah where he was able to share his talent and serve so many for years. He devoted countless hours to studying and refining his techniques, ensuring the utmost care for his patients. All while giving hope for healing, to all he treated.
