Edward Lee Black, 87, of Lehi, Utah, passed away on December 26, 2023.

Lee was born on July 6, 1936 to William Richard Black and Elsie Ireta Stewart Black (both deceased) in Blanding, Utah. After Lee graduated from Provo High School in 1954, he attended BYU for one year and then was inducted into the United States Army. He traveled extensively and retired as Lieutenant Colonel from the military. He loved his country and took an oath to support and defend the constitution of the United States of America which he did for 32 years.

Lee graduated from Utah State University with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology and a minor in Building Construction Technology. His 2nd career was with the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture as an administrative officer. He then worked full time in his own business of remodeling and flipping houses in Texas.

Lee was a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He served in many callings and capacities including a total of 4 missions, bishop, and temple ordinance worker.

Lee is survived by his wife of over 40 years, Marsha Hunsaker Black, and his seven children, Christopher John Black of Cape Coral, FL, David John Black of Salt Lake City, UT, Anne Cook of Carlsbad, CA, Linda Lee Boatman of Great Falls, MT, Wendy Sue Maness of St. Louis, MO, Laura Tidwell of Amarillo, TX, Shauna Boyce of Saratoga Springs, UT, and 22 grandchildren.
