



Elizabeth Ann Passey

December 12, 1931 - October 21, 2013

Elizabeth Ann Passey (81), our loving mother, grandmother and great-grandmother, passed away on Monday, October 21, 2013. Elizabeth was born December 12, 1931 in Saint Charles, Bear Lake, Idaho, the daughter of Kurt Ragner Anderson and Delpha Elizabeth Arnell. She was the youngest of four children.

At the age of seven, Elizabeth was diagnosed as being in the first stages of polio meningitis and was bed ridden for several months. She couldn't have visitors, because the doctors weren't sure whether it was contagious.

Elizabeth remembered her mother kneeling by her bed and pleading with the Lord to let her be healed. She had to learn to walk and talk all over again, but through the power of prayer and the power of the priesthood, Elizabeth was blessed with a complete recovery.

She wore her hair in beautiful long braids until her mother let her cut them off at the age of 13. In her junior year at Fielding High School, Elizabeth, who was the student body secretary and later captain of the pep squad, fell in love with the soon-to-be captain of the football team, L. Keith Passey. They became engaged right after high school graduation and were married on September 11, 1950 in the Logan Temple.

Growing up in a small farming community in Bear Lake valley, Elizabeth never

imagined that she would live in so many different places. During their marriage, Elizabeth and Keith moved 19 times due to military and business transfers. During these many moves, Elizabeth always made sure her five sons had a loving home to grow up in and to return to with their families.

In addition to raising five sons, Elizabeth had numerous church callings including serving as Primary president in Big Springs, TX, Plattsburg, NY and Bountiful, UT; Young Women's president in Atlanta, GA; Relief Society president in Plattsburg, NY, Vacaville, CA and Athens, GA; Stake Young Women's president in Pleasanton, CA and Long Island, NY; and Stake Relief Society president in Vacaville, CA. She also served as an ordinance worker for several years in the Oakland, CA and Bountiful, UT temples.

After her sons married and moved away, she took up several different hobbies. She made her first porcelain doll in 1985 and since then made close to 100 unique "Libby" dolls. She also loved to quilt and made dozens of beautiful "Libby" quilts. She and Keith also enjoyed square dancing and in the early 1990's they square danced regularly with two different square dancing groups in California. Elizabeth began keeping a journal at the age of 12, which she continued well into her seventies. Her journals serve as a lasting memory for her sons, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Among the many gifts she has given to her family, she left over 40 photo journals detailing the lives of her sons and their families.

Elizabeth is survived by her sons, Alan (Denise), Alexandria, Virginia; Steven (Elaine) Fruit Heights, Utah; Paul (Cheryl), Myrtle Beach, South Carolina; Michael (Engracia), Vacaville, California; and Darrell, Centerville, Utah. She had 25 grandchildren, and 27 great grandchildren. She is also survived by her brother Carl Anderson (Elaine), Hyrum, Utah, and sister Mildred Arnell, Montpelier, Idaho.

This world is a much better place because of Elizabeth Passey. Her family and loved ones will miss her, but will always be grateful for her life and all she gave. We are comforted knowing that she is now reunited with her high school sweetheart and that their eternal journey can continue together.

A viewing will be held in her honor on Friday, October 25 from 6-8 p.m. at the LDS Country Lane Chapel, 24 South Country Lane in Fruit Heights, Utah. A second viewing will be held at the same location on Saturday, October 26 from 9:30 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. Funeral services will be held immediately following the viewing at 11 a.m. at the Country Lane Chapel. The burial will follow at the Kaysville City Cemetery.

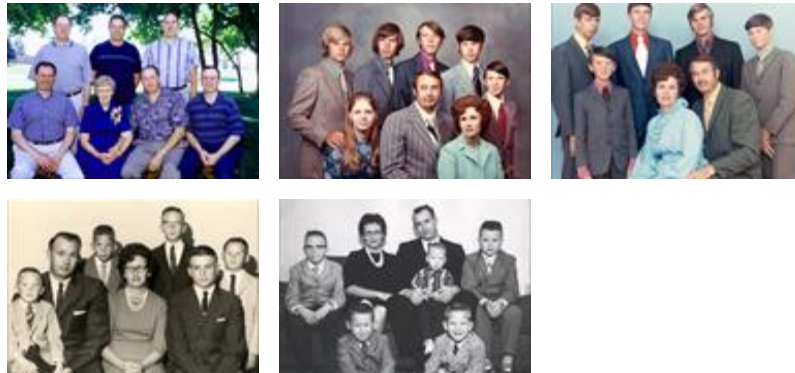
