Dad worked for the county engineering department and we lived there until 1959 when we moved to Asker. I think Erna was around 5-6 years old when we moved. Shortly after Erna was born we went on vacation to North Norway. My dad had bought a VW beetle black in color and Erna slept in a small little compartment behind the back seat. Little did she know that she was traveling 2000 miles to see her grandma and grandpa Johansen in Børselv, Finnmark, Norway. We were a close family and we did many things together. It was in Asker where Erna learned to play the guitar. Both Erna and and Thor excelled playing and singing. We used to entertain guests when they came to our house. I wasn't very good at playing the guitar but I had a decent voice so I chimed in. Erna had a beautiful voice and she was a great guitar player. Erna will be sorely missed. She and I attended BYU together. I remember one Christmas at BYU that everyone had gone home for Christmas and we were alone in our apartments that we were invited to come and spend Christmas Eve with Mary Mckonkie and her husband. Christmas Day we spent time together and we were happy that we had one another or that Christmas would have been very lonely with everyone gone. Erna has always been a loving and supportive sister. We were so sad when she was diagnosed with cancer but we hoped and prayed that she would pull through. I will miss her merry laugh and amazing hugs. I love you Erna. I had the privilege of giving her several blessings in which the Lord's love was manifest. Very tender moments in both of our lives.
