Ferron Mel Pearson, age 77, returned home to his parents, Heavenly and earthly, on April 11th, 2026 surrounded by family at his home in Sandy, Utah. Ferron was born on March 17th, 1949, in Salt Lake City, Utah to Berley and Roy Pearson. He married Charlotte Becky Ann Jensen on August 16, 1971 in the Salt Lake Temple.

Ferron and Becky first lived in Boise, Idaho for nine years, before moving to Port Orchard, Washington. Four years later, they moved to Sandy, Utah, in 1983, where they lived until his passing.

Ferron earned his Associate's Degree in Business from Boise State University. He continued his education through insurance courses, furthering his education and career. Ferron worked as a claims adjuster for two different insurance companies and retired as a claims manager from Bear River Mutual Insurance Company in 2014. Ferron also served in the military for nearly 30 years, ending his career as a Master Sergeant in the Air National Guard.

Ferron and Becky loved to travel, especially camping at the family property in Idaho and at Bryce Canyon. They loved riding ATVs with family and friends. Ferron loved to collect clocks, watches, and anything pertaining to bears and owls.

Ferron served his Heavenly Father well in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. He served a mission in San Antonio, Texas in 1968 for two years. Other service included being a primary teacher, Sunday School President, Elders Quorum President and Ward Executive Secretary for Bishop George McNeil.

Ferron was a very social man. He would get to know people everywhere he went. He was always talking to someone and thus made many lasting friendships.

Ferron is survived by his loving wife of 54 years, Charlotte Becky Ann Pearson, his brother Leon Pearson, his children, Brad Pearson, Kim Vance, Tim Pearson, and Hayley Pearson, eight grandchildren, and one great grandson. Ferron was preceded in death by his parents Berley and Roy Pearson as well as his two brothers, Myron and Eldon Pearson.

My favorite memory of Ferron was when Larry and I stayed with you before we started having kids. We had such a great time. I remember going to Mulboon's for steak dinner. They had all you could eat cocktail shrimp as an appetizer. I was never so stuffed as I was that day. It was such a good meal! We slept on your sofa hide-a-bed downstairs.

After Mulboon's, we went to visit a mall. We were all in rather a great mood and having fun. I remember encouraging Ferron to roll down his window and whistle at the "chicks" (girls that were waiting at the crosswalks) at the various stoplights that we encountered on the way to the mall. I distinctly remember your face when he actually did it! You slugged his shoulder. I don't remember the mall we went to, but it was quite something at the time as Boise (Salt Lake wannabes) did not have anything nearly as spectacular. I remember dressing up a bit and wearing my 4-inch-high heeled shoes. I still remember twisting my ankle and wishing that I had NOT worn them.

Unfortunately, after that came kids, complications and post-partum depression.

Another favorite time was BEFORE Larry and I got married. He took me to meet the fam. at your Aunt Bonnie's house. I was so overwhelmed and unsure of myself. I asked what I could do to help in the kitchen, as my Mom taught me to do, and was given a potato masher to mash real potatoes. I had absolutely no idea what to do as my parents used a Mashed Potato mix. Ferron made me feel at ease and I instantly decided that I really liked him. He helped to feel not so awkward with your extended family. I will always appreciate him for that.

These are the memories I will choose to retain about Ferron Pearson and not the past 20 or so years of strained relationships.

Sorry we could not attend the funeral in person, but were glad that it was "zoomed" and we were able to view it online. We just did not have the \$3,000.00 it would have taken to fly down or we would certainly have come!
