With tender hearts we said goodbye to Frank Delano Wengert, our beloved husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather, in the early morning hours of August 27, 2022. Having lived a long, and full life, due to age related causes, he returned home to his Heavenly Father's waiting arms peacefully in his home surrounded by his loved ones.

Frank was born on July 6, 1928 to Delano Frank Wengert and Clare Dorothy Taylor in Las Vegas, Nevada. His family lived periodically in Nevada, Utah and California.

Frank met the love of his life, Irene Leavitt Wengert, a 13 year blonde toe-head who fell head over heels in love with Frank, and he with her. After a five year romance, they were married on July 16, 1949 in Las Vegas, Nevada.
