Gail was born June 14, 1945, in Huntington Park, California, to Jack Marshall and Roxie Palmer before moving to and being raised in Grace, Idaho (where she graduated high school in 1963), Gail married and had two sons Douglas and Michael Bohne.

Gail dedicated her life to serving others. She graduated from, St. Mark's School of Nursing in 1966, then went on to serve as a registered nurse, in both a care management role and in the hospital settings. She spent many years working in the ICU unit of different hospitals in Utah and California. Gail loved being a nurse and used those skills both professionally and at home.
