George Lawrence Ostergar passed away February 13, 2016. He was born on September 3, 1943, to Mary Ellen Christiansen and Lawrence Carlsen Ostergar in Ogden, Utah. He spent most of his childhood in Rupert, Idaho and the last years of his life in West Valley City, Utah.

He proudly served our country in the US Army from 1964 to 1967 and in 1991 reenlisted in the Utah Air National Guard where he served as a Heavy Mobile Equipment Mechanic in the 130th Engineering Installation Squadron; retiring as a Senior Master Sergeant in 2003.
