Glen Earl Lockhart was born in Salt Lake City to Betty Rae and Glen B. Lockhart on June 17, 1947. On February 24, 2020 Glen passed away due to complications related to a stroke he suffered in December 2018.

This lead Glen to have a lifelong appreciation of birds. Glen enjoyed woodworking, building Glen and Z's dream house, investing, and driving Charlie the Tractor. The arrival of his grandson, Riley, was truly a treasured hour in his life.
