Grace Haunani “Nani” Mackey-Rangiuiaia (Vincent) of O’ahu, Hawai’i passed away on Tuesday, July 20, 2021 at the University of Utah Hospital in Salt Lake City, Utah. Nani was born on May 5, 1958, in Honolulu, Hawaii to parents Henry Vincent Jr. and Lulu Keikilohi Kong. Nani was a loving wife, aunt, sister, and friend.

After graduating from Kamehameha Schools Kapalama Campus, Nani earned her Bachelor’s Degree in Business Management at Brigham Young University – Hawaii Campus in Laie, Hawaii, where she met and married her husband David Ashley Mackey-Rangiuiaia. They were sealed for time and all eternity in the Laie Hawaii Temple. After marriage, Nani and Dave spent several years living in Honolulu, Hawaii.

After a brief time residing in Fiji, and traveling to New Zealand, Nani and Dave decided to make their home in Arizona.
