H. Brent Lund, 85, returned to his Heavenly Father, January 14, 2024. He was born July 19, 1938, in Idaho Falls, Idaho to Harold Everett Lund and Lucille Larsen Lund. He married Julia Ann Sorenson on December 14, 1956. Brent grew up in the Idaho Falls area and attended Idaho Falls High School, where he met and later married, his high school sweetheart. He was active in the car club and aspired to race cars as a career. That was not a popular decision with his parents, and he was then “strongly encouraged” to pursue a career as an electrician. He spent the next 40 plus years in the trade. He started out in Idaho, then moved his wife and young family, three sons and a daughter, to Southern California, where he worked and lived for the next 40 years. He was very talented and accomplished in his trade and was often called upon specifically by name, to work on jobs because of his well-known work ethic and attention to detail. Having three sons, he was very involved with Pop Warner and Junior All-American Football for many years, coaching and mentoring young athletes, while also winning many championship titles. When he wasn't on the football field, there were many Saturday morning Little League baseball games, and later, with his youngest and only daughter, girls' softball games to attend. As his three young sons grew older and interests changed to cars and high school sports, Brent began a 20 plus year involvement as a referee with Orange County Football Officials Association, and simultaneously was active in the Orange County Basketball Officials Association, where he served as president for a time. He also umpired Little

League Baseball in his local community. Mingled in amongst all the weekday and weekend sports, he volunteered with the Boy Scouts of America program. Hiking was a great love of his, and this program allowed him to teach life skills, lead and foster a love of the outdoors, build confidence and encourage teamwork among the youth. He also enjoyed hunting and was a great fisherman. He was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, where he served in many positions, including head of the basketball referees in the church's regional basketball program. He was often offering acts of service and being helpful to anyone that needed an extra hand. When he retired from the electrical trade, he and his wife Julie left beautiful Southern California, many family members, friends and memories, and moved to Alpine Utah opening the next chapter of his life. In keeping with his charitable ways, he quickly became a regular fixture on snow days and was quick to jump on his ATV and plow snow for many neighbors. His retirement did not last long, as he started an Inspection company in the construction field, with his oldest son, Richard. When it was time to move on from that adventure, much to his delight, Cabela's built a brand-new store in his community. His oldest granddaughter, who had already secured employment there, encouraged him to do the same. He spent the next fifteen years working on the maintenance crew in the store. One of his duties was to feed the fish in the giant fish tank room, one of the things Cabela's is known for. He would always let the children in his neighborhood, his church, and any child in the store that was interested, help him with that task, as it became a favorite, as well as he became their favorite.

He is survived by his spouse of 67 years, Julie Sorenson Lund; their children: Mark Lund, Craig Lund, Kelley Lund Hawkins; Eight grandchildren: Justin (Elizabeth) Lund, Dallin Hawkins, Jason Lund, Megan Hawkins Sharaf, Travis (Karen) Hawkins, Trevor (Karlle) Hawkins, Amber Hawkins, Blake Lund, seven great-grandchildren, Joslyn Hawkins, Ryan Lund, Tayzen Hawkins, Olivia Sharaf, Indy Hawkins, Roman Sharaf, Brooks Hawkins; sister Linda Lund Shroll, three Brothers-in-law, two Sisters-in law, and many nieces and

nephews, all of which he loved.
