James has requested no formal services. He will be cremated with a portion of

his remains interned at Veterans' Cemetery 17111 South Camp Williams Road (just north of Camp Williams on Redwood Road) Bluffdale, UT. Internment will take place at 10:00 am.

We will be holding an informal gathering following the internment in the chapel at that location. Whether you are able to attend or not, Jim has asked that, those who wish to remember him, go to a favorite place, think of him and drink a liquid of choice.
