Jorge Antonio Sagastume, age 69, passed away on September 8, 2025, in Murray, Utah. first, striving to provide them with the opportunities he never had. He worked tirelessly to ensure their lives were filled with love, stability, and hope. He was hands-on in every way, always trying to fix what was broken, whether it was something around the house or a moment in our lives that needed mending.

As the only son among eight sisters, Jorge embraced the role of a loving and dedicated guide, always supporting their well-being. Their daily conversations were cherished moments, filled with laughter, jokes, and heartfelt check-ins that strengthened their close bond and reflected the deep love he had for his sisters.

His love extended beyond people. His loyal dog Ronan (or “Ro-ne-ey,” as he affectionately called him) was his constant companion and brought him immense joy.

Together with Hilitana Coronado, he co-founded a nonprofit organization dedicated to helping youth and young adults overcome drug and alcohol addiction. His life’s work impacted countless people. Through counseling, education, and recovery planning, Jorge brought hope to those who needed it most. He especially loved visiting shelters, offering not just food and conversation, but also dignity, encouragement, and kindness.

He lived a life of purpose, compassion, and unwavering love. His legacy lives on in the lives he touched and, in our hearts, forever.

Siempre estaba presente, buscando arreglar lo que estaba roto, ya fuera algo en casa o un momento en nuestras vidas que necesitaba reparación.

Como único hijo varón entre ocho hermanas, Jorge asumió con amor y entrega el papel de guía y apoyo incondicional. Sus conversaciones diarias con ellas eran momentos muy apreciados, llenos de risas, bromas y gestos sinceros que fortalecían su vínculo y reflejaban el profundo amor que les tenía.

Su amor iba más allá de las personas. Su perro fiel Ronan (o “Ro-ne-ey”, como lo llamaba con cariño) fue su compañero constante y le brindó una inmensa alegría.

Junto a Hiliana Coronado, cofundó una organización sin fines de lucro dedicada a ayudar a jóvenes a superar la adicción a las drogas y al alcohol. Su trabajo impactó a innumerables vidas. A través de la consejería, la educación y la planificación de recuperación, Jorge llevó esperanza a quienes más lo necesitaban. Le encantaba visitar refugios, donde ofrecía no solo

alimentos y conversación, sino también dignidad, ánimo y bondad.

Vivió una vida con propósito, compasión y amor inquebrantable. Su legado vive en las vidas que tocó y en nuestros corazones, para siempre.
