Joseph Earl Peterson Jr., 84, passed away peacefully at home in Murray, Utah on February 20, 2025, in his den surrounded by his beloved books. He was born on August 27, 1940, in Rio Tinto, Nevada, to Joseph Earl Peterson Sr. and Velma Nilene Hughes Peterson. He was the second of ten children.

Joseph left home at 17 years old and began his military career in the Army. He proudly served in the U.S. Army for eight years as a Master electrician, with assignments in Alaska, Korea, Germany, and Washington D.C. His expertise later took him to remarkable places around the world, including Saudi Arabia.

Joseph married Kerry Kinder in 1968 and later divorced in 1976. Together they had one daughter, Heather.

Joseph married his sweetheart Loretta Brown on February 3rd, 1983, at his home in Price Utah. They were later sealed for eternity in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. Together they have four children: Jared, Brittany, Alex and Courtney.

Joseph dedicated his life to service and hard work. Joseph was a proud member in good standing of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 354 since 1966. He concluded his career at the Tooele Chemical Agent Disposal Facility (TOCDF), where he played a vital role in the destruction of chemical weapons such as mustard gas and VX. Joseph retired

in October 2013 when the facility had successfully destroyed all chemical weapons.

Beyond his professional life, Joseph found great joy in intellectual pursuits. He was an avid chess player who appreciated the strategy and patience the game required. He also dedicated much of his time to reading and studying history and religious literature. Throughout his life he collected books and built an extensive library. Joseph was known for his brilliant mind and an exceptional ability to process numbers mentally with ease.

Joseph also enjoyed working with his hands and particularly enjoyed woodworking. He was the one to call if you needed electrical or construction assistance. He was very generous and kindhearted towards others. Joseph was always one who could be counted on to help. He loved the holidays and spent time shopping for gifts and food for the family to enjoy. He also enjoyed decorating for Christmas and particularly loved his woodsy Christmas tree and singing angels.

Joseph was a devoted member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and valued his faith deeply. Together, Joseph and his wife served a mission in Nauvoo, Illinois. Joseph also enjoyed spending time doing his family history and serving in the Temple. For Christmas this year Joseph wrote down his testimony for a record to all his family. Joseph possessed a strong testimony of His Savior Jesus Christ.
