Julia Ann Sorenson Lund, 86, made a peaceful return to her Heavenly Father on October 26, 2025, surrounded by her family in Alpine, Utah. She was born December 7, 1938 in Paul, Idaho to Seldon Dale Sorenson and June Moncur Sorenson. She married Harold Brent Lund on December 14, 1956.
