



June "Patrice" Glithero

June 8, 1925 - January 18, 2024

June Patricia Tobiason was born in Everett, Washington, on June 8, 1925. She passed away peacefully at Sunrise Care Center in Sandy, Utah, on January 18, 2024. She was 98 years old.

Her life was full and eventful. At a young age she began supporting her family by singing in nightclubs in the Seattle area. Most notably, The China Pheasant, where she headlined and earned enough to be the major breadwinner for her family.

Eventually, Patrice (known then as Patty), along with her sisters formed a successful "girl's threesome" known as the Taylor Maids – billed as a "Harmonizing Trio." The three of them recorded several singles (Nu Nu Nu, Bandana, and I Almost Lost My Mind, among others). The girls toured Korea with Bob Hope and The Les Brown Band in the 50's during the Korean War. In 1955, the group recorded the theme to the movie I Am A Camera (Pogo Stick).

After the group disbanded, Patrice began to produce recording albums. These included All Right, Ok, You Win with Trombonist Dick Noel and the Academy Brass.

Patrice eventually settled in Miami, Florida, and Pebble Beach, California,

where she became an avid golfer.

Patrice is succeeded by her daughter, Lynn Carlson; son, Robert Nibbe; daughter, Joanne Frost; 6 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.
