“ *Ken Limon was one of the bravest patients I've ever worked with. Ken was always kind, and humble, in the midst of the repercussions of his last stroke. He was unable to see and asked for very little from the nursing staff at Mt. Olympus SNF, where I worked as a Rehabilitative Speech-Language Pathologist, evaluating his memory, and communication. He was left blind, and needed to rely on knowing where his phone, chewing tobacco and coffee was so he could get through the day. He worked very hard to remember, and had no memory of his stroke, only relying on his wonderful son, Christopher, to connect with, and waited patiently for Chris to come and see him at the end of the day. I was able to get to know Kenneth when asking about his family and life on the Res.. He loved his Native Culture and I would have loved to see him Dance. Even though he retired as an Active Medic and USA Military soldier, I had so much respect for him as he was independent, living in a great apartment in SLC, he told me many times he wanted to just go home and lay down on his couch and listen to music and or "watch some movies". He deeply loved his Son Christopher and was very proud of him. He loved his granddaughter, Naiah, and loved that she was her own person and had a brilliant sense of self, a little mischievous, probably like his son Christopher. He would smile a big smile about Naiah. I am very honored to of known Kenneth Duane Limon, during my lifetime. It is a shame that he had to leave this life so young. Chris and Naiah, You will see him again in the afterlife and will have his body, brain, and physical senses returned to him. He lives on through the two of you. I have much Respect and Honor for Kenneth and for his sacrifices and love of living life to its fullest. God Bless you all that are in his family.*
