



Kent Warren Woodbury

May 28, 1955 - March 19, 2026

Kent Warren Woodbury, Sr., 70, of West Jordan, Utah, passed away peacefully at Huntsman Cancer Institute on March 19, 2026, after a lifelong struggle with Myotonic Muscular dystrophy (DM) and an 18-year battle with cancer. He was surrounded in his final moments by the people who were most dear to him.

Born in Granger, Utah, Kent graduated from the University of Utah with a B.S. in Mathematics and Statistics. He was a committed, dependable professional, who devoted forty years to Rocky Mountain Power as an operations analyst and statistician.

Kent was a lifelong music lover and gifted singer. He was proud of his performances with his high school Madrigals and continued to share his talents in community performances including ballets with Mountain West Ballet and theater with Herriman City. He played piano, organ, dulcimer, and guitar. A dedicated sports fan, Kent rarely missed a University of Utah football game over 36 years. In his youth he participated in high school football and wrestling, and he always enjoyed a good round of golf. He was adept with computers from the punchcard days through the dawn of the AI era and always kept abreast of the latest technology. As a young man he lived in Argentina for two years, an experience that enriched his love of language, culture, and food.

He met his wife, Ann, in high school when he started dating her best friend. It took a few tries, but Ann managed to steal him away and keep him for herself. They celebrated their 49th anniversary just before he passed away.

He is survived by his wife, Ann Woodbury; son Kent Warren Woodbury, Jr. and partner Tanya Platt; daughter Andrea McCullough and son-in-law Mark McCullough; grandsons Dakoata McCullough and Kiason McCullough; and son Chad B. Woodbury. He was preceded in death by Michael J. Woodbury.
