She adored fashion, and always dressed impeccably. Her love of plants, nature, and cooking reflected the nurturing way she cared for those around her.

Kevi's heart was as expansive as her adventures. She never missed a birthday or special occasion, always sending thoughtful, personal gifts to her sisters, nieces, nephews, great-nieces, and great-nephews. She loved them all as if they were her own children and grandchildren – showering them with affection and creating lifelong memories.

Her constant companion for the past 14 years was her beloved dog, Chester, who she took everywhere. He brought her comfort, companionship, and love, especially in her later years.
