Laurel Bastian Heil passed away peacefully after a long fight with cancer on Tuesday, January 24th, 2023, in Salt Lake City, Utah.

She is survived by her loving husband Andrew (Andy), their four daughters Carrie (husband Bradford), Madison, Shannon (husband Cody), and Sidney. She was the proud grandma of one granddaughter Hero, and two grandsons Liam and Deacon. She is also survived by her mother, Mary Ellen, and four siblings Nathan (wife Shawn), Amy (husband Kim), Susan (husband Gary), and Brooke (husband Shawn).

Laurel was born in 1965 and was the oldest of Roger and Mary Ellen's five children. She served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Atlanta, Georgia and went on to receive a bachelors in Mathematics from Brigham Young University. While at BYU she met Andy during a ward river rafting trip where she asked to use his shoulder to rest on. They were then married in the Salt Lake City Temple in December of 1988.

Laurel loved to serve and teach, and did so through callings in both her ward and stake Relief Society and Young Womens, as well as through her example of love for everyone in all she did. She loved to paint with watercolors, bake homemade bread to share with family and neighbors, try and recommend new recipes, and to sew and make dresses for her daughters and later her

granddaughter. She worked as a substitute teacher for many years, and enjoyed helping the teachers and children in their classes. She loved being a grandma and teasing her daughters that the reward of being a parent was having grandchildren.
