March 7, 1935 - March 31, 2019

Our beloved Patriarch of our family, “Maloni Tupou Heimuli”, peacefully passed through the veil to join our beloved Matriarch Kesaia Tiueti Heimuli (March 23, 2013) on Sunday, March 31st at the age of 84. Born on March 7th, 1935 in Olo’ua, Vavau.

The eldest son of 8 children born to Semisi V. & Losaline Mau Heimuli. At the age of 16 his Father passed away and he quickly inherited the role of caring for his Mother & 7 siblings. With little to no knowledge of any trade, except fishing a skill that was passed down to him by his father a skilled fisherman. He was a self-taught deep sea diver and farmer. By mastering these trades he sold his goods so that he could earn money to afford his 7 siblings an education, in which they all pursued because of his tireless efforts.

He was quite a handsome suitor. A naturally talented dancer, musician and drummer. Those talents offered him an opportunity to travel to the different villages with the Kings entourage of dancers to entertain villagers in his travels. This eventually landed him in Nukualofa, Tongatapu where he resided with his Uncle who would introduce him too the love of his life Kesaia Tiueti Lapuaho, in Fuamotu, Tongatapu where they were married on October 31st, 1961, which was later solemnized in the Auckland, New Zealand Temple in November of 1968.

We are eternally grateful for the 6yrs we were gifted to be with him, although he longed to be with Mom. Grandpa was a stalwart provider, simple, humble, mild mannered, quiet devoted Father, Grandfather, Brother, Uncle & Friend. He lived an honest, simple, peaceful life, much like how he departed this earth. We will miss his caring spirit, his uncanny sense of humor, his soft spoken voice, his unconditional love, his kindness he showed towards all, but most of all his loving smile that illuminated his countenance and radiated your heart. We honor our Father by his example of exactness and simple obedience. He was a man of very few words, but lead fearlessly by example.

His greatest treasures on earth were his 46 grandchildren & 43 great grandchildren, that he was so proud of. That is evident in his makeshift collage of pictures that adorn the wall of his home as you enter.

We are saddened by his departure, but overjoyed in Happiness that his mission on earth is fulfilled and that his long awaited wish has been granted to join our beloved Mother.
