Marion Rosel Andersen, passed away on April 28th 2018 at the age of 71. He was born January 9th 1947 in Nyssa, Oregon, to Rosel Griffin Andersen and Della Lois Mitchell. He married his high school sweetheart, Joy Christine Searle, and was sealed May 6th 1968 in the Logan Temple.

Marion was a lifetime Northern Utah resident and a lifetime student of science.
