Marsha Lynne Elzinga Larson, 86, died Tuesday February 11, 2025, at her assisted living/memory care center in Herriman, UT.

She was born July 29, 1938, in Salt Lake City, UT to Charles Sybrand Elzinga and Joyce Clark Elzinga. She was the eldest daughter of 14 children. She graduated from Burley High School in 1956 after living in Utah, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, and Washington. She attended Ricks College (now known as BYU-Idaho) for 1 year. She married Gene Melvin Larson September 10, 1957, in the Logan, UT Temple of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints

She was the mother to 9 children, grandmother to 11 grandchildren, and great grandmother to 18 great grandchildren and 1 great-great grandchild. She served in various Church callings throughout her life including teacher, chorister, and compassionate service leader and was an active temple attender.

She is survived by 2 sons and 3 daughters: Jon Larson (Tina), Jacob Larson, Jane Larson, Jennifer Larson, and Juliet Larson.
