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On January 13, 2019, our beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle and friend, Peni Tonga Malohifo'ou passed away unexpectedly in Riverton, Utah surrounded by his loving family. Peni was born in Neiafu, Vava'u, Tonga on October 18, 1955 as the youngest son of 'Ana Tamutamu Toki & Tonga Poteki Malohifo'ou. He graduated from Liahona High School in 1973 and served an LDS mission in the Fijian Islands where he opened up the Vanuatu Mission. He continued his education at BYU-Hawai'i and later at BYU-Provo.

On February 04, 1988, he married the love of his life, Shelly Dee Nickle and were later sealed in the LDS Salt Lake temple.

Throughout his life, Peni found ways to always be of service to others and his community, whether it was serving as a musician and dancer at the Polynesian Culture Center or working for companies like Mountain Bell, Quest Communication, Delta airlines and most recently as a funeral Director at the Serenity funeral home. 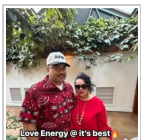
