After a long battle with COPD, Bob passed away peacefully, surrounded by his family Christmas morning.

Born in Hammond, IN. He joined the Navy the day after his 17th birthday. He served 4 years as a Machinist Mate, and was discharged as the youngest 1st Class, Petty Officer in the Navy (at the time).

The day after discharge he became a Civil Servant at Naval Station "North Island" in Coronado, CA. In September 2000 he completed his distinguished career with 38 year of service to the US Navy. The Navy brought him to his beloved San Diego in 1962, where he lived for 59 years.

He enjoyed family and friends, often with harrowing tales of a tough childhood and lively political debates. He was an advocate for the vulnerable and a fierce champion of the Military. His later years were filled with gardening, cooking, traveling, and spirits with buddies, catching up with family.
