Seloni Fie'eiki Kaiokamalie, 65, passed away on April 18, 2016, in Provo, Utah. She was born on February 25, 1951, in Lotoha'apai, Tongatapu to Selu Havea Fie'eiki and Simote Fie'eiki. She married 'Etuete Kaiokamalie in Oakland, California on February 22, 2003 and later sealed in the Mount Timpanogos Temple.

Mom lived an abundant life full of faith and happiness. She lived the majority of her life in Tonga, California, and Utah. She served in many callings for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
