“ I got to know my older sister Shirley when the family put our mother in a nursing home. We all looked up to Shirley and Larry and trusted them to know what and how to arrange everything required. This took a toll on her that she bore with great dignity. I know it haunted her for a long time after our mother death.

I was a flower girl at her wedding at age 7 so my memories of her were limited. Mostly her telling me I had to eat the vegetables on my plate before I could go out and play again (I usually vomited).

But, after our mother died we started to converse with each other.

We each had very different memories of our childhoods and our parents. What was similar was that we both grew up with little love and intervention from our parents. The older kids like Shirley got out early. We all had scars some more visible than others. Shirley was strong on the outside and sweet and vulnerable on the inside. I know we all depended on her strength too much, I depended on her strength too much.

When she got Parkinson's she called me and ask me to help her die. I took that as a very special bond we had. She knew I would do it if I could. Instead she suffered too long and too much, keeping her head up and only getting scared when she couldn't deny reality. As I do not believe in any God, I choose to think of her freely soaring above the desert in early mornings, when the pink reaches the tops of the Kayenta mountains.....I think she would like that.
