She was also known for her incredible skill as a cake decorator whose beautiful and delicious cakes helped make birthdays, weddings, and family celebrations unforgettable.

Despite her many talents, Suzanne cherished simple, peaceful moments. She loved reading, working on puzzles, and relaxing with a Lifetime or Hallmark movie nearby. Her home was always warm and welcoming, often with a quilt in progress and a sweet treat ready for anyone who stopped by.

Suzanne loved and served with her whole heart. She was often the first to bring a meal, offer help, or lend a listening ear. Her children relied on her wisdom, kindness, and encouragement, and she rarely missed an event or milestone in their lives. She was also a loyal friend whose relationships spanned decades.
