Trudy Ann Pearson, 60, passed away July 18, 2018 at her home in Riverton Utah. Trudy was born May 22, 1958 in San Diego California to Martha Evelyn Dillman, and Wayne Nils Hallstrom.

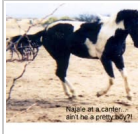
