



Zaida Paz Sanabria

July 5, 1932 - July 12, 2019

Zaida nació el 5 de Julio de 1932 en la ciudad de Capinota, Cochabamba, Bolivia. Sus padres Julio Paz y Justina Rivas, tenía 87 años de vida al terminar su tiempo de probación el 12 de Julio de 2019, en la ciudad de Lago Salado, Utah, rodeada de sus hijos. Ahora se ha reunido con sus padres y sus hermanos Ema y Edgar y con su amada niña Narda Ernestina quienes le antecedieron en su partida.

Contrajo matrimonio con Guillermo Sanabria en la ciudad de Oruro, Bolivia y procrearon seis hijos, de los cuales todavía cinco estuvieron con ella hasta sus últimos momentos. Hermosa y talentosa mujer, esposa y madre; uno de sus grandes talentos fue confeccionar ropa para sus hijos, especialmente para sus eventos escolares, no importaban las horas de la noche, pero ella terminaba sus proyectos para cumplir con esas responsabilidades. Nunca faltó comida en nuestra mesa, inclusive ella siempre estaba dispuesta a viajar largas distancias en Capinota para conseguir lo que necesitaba.

Vivió con su familia en las ciudades de Oruro, Uyuni, Capinota y finalmente en La Paz, donde su vida cambió radicalmente cuando los misioneros Lamar Stallin y Bell de la Iglesia de Jesucristo de los Santos de los Ultimos Dias la visitaron hace 52 años. El 17 de Octubre de 1967 toda la familia se bautizó y ésto fué el comienzo de una nueva vida centrada en el Evangelio de Jesucristo.

En el año de 1972 y después de una experiencia milagrosa, luego de sellarse a su esposo en el Templo de Los Angeles, California por este tiempo y por

toda la eternidad, se quedaron a vivir en Estados Unidos. Zaida siempre puso al Señor en primer lugar, sirviendo a su prójimo, era una asidua visitante al Templo, inclusive trabajó como obrera en los Templos de Cochabamba y Lago Salado. Le gustaba compartir lo que tenía; Cada vez que visitaba Bolivia era una alegría para vecinos y niños de su barrio ya que siempre tenía regalos para ellos. Se quedó a radicar en Lago Salado con su esposo y sus hijos que eran el mayor tesoro que tenía.

Le sobreviven su esposo Guillermo, sus hijos Eduardo, Ernesto, Elda, Elizabeth y Narda, sus hijos políticos Lilian, Carmen Rosa (ex-nuera), Albert, Mohamed y David; 20 nietos y 41 Bisnietos, sus hermanos Hilda y Milton. Te amamos y sabemos que un día estaremos juntos para siempre.

Zaida was born on July 5, 1932 in the city of Capinota, Cochabamba, Bolivia. Her parents, Julio Paz and Justina Rivas. She was 87 years old at the end of her probation on July 12, 2019, in the city of Salt Lake, Utah, surrounded by her children. Now she has met with her parents and her brothers Ema and Edgar and her beloved girl Narda Ernestina who preceded her in her departure.

She married Guillermo Sanabria in the city of Oruro, Bolivia and they had six children, of whom five were still with her until her last moments. A beautiful and talented woman, wife and mother; One of her great talents was making clothes for her children, especially for school events, no matter the hours of the night, but she finished her projects to fulfill those responsibilities. There was never a lack of food at our table, even she was always willing to travel long distances in Capinota to get what she needed.

She lived with her family in the cities of Oruro, Uyuni, Capinota and finally in La Paz, where her life changed radically when missionaries Lamar Stalin and Bell of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints visited 52 years ago. On October 17, 1967, the whole family was baptized and this was the beginning of a new life centered on the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In the year of 1972 was a miraculous experience, after sealing to her husband

in the Temple of Los Angeles, California for time and for all eternity, they stayed to live in the United States. Zaida always put the Lord first, serving her neighbors, was a regular visitor to the Temple, even worked as a worker in the Temples of Cochabamba and Salt Lake. She liked to share what she had; Every time she visited Bolivia it was a joy for neighbors and children in their neighborhood since she always had gifts for them. She stayed in Salt Lake City with her husband and children, which was the greatest treasure she had. She is survived by her husband Guillermo, their children Eduardo, Ernesto, Elda, Elizabeth and Narda, her son/daughter-in-laws Lilian, Carmen Rosa (ex-daughter-in-law), Albert, Mohamed and David; 20 grandchildren 41 great-grandchildren, and her siblings Hilda and Milton.

We love you and we know that one day we will be together forever.
