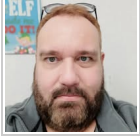

“ Just found out today that a very special friend of mine passed away. I got to know her while I was working at the Sugarhouse clinic. She was diagnosed with COPD and it took her away from us this past Wednesday. I always looked forward to her visits at the clinic and my provider would have me schedule her appointments for longer so that all of us could just sit and talk. She was like my mother. I always told her that she could have been my mother's little sister because they looked alike, had the same health difficulties and she knew how to be inappropriate. We would just sit and tell each other stories and make off color comments and then laugh and laugh and laugh. Every visit I would walk her out to lobby, we would give each other a great big hug and I would say "see you next month, Mom."

We celebrated all the special occasions...the birth of her great grandson, holidays and birthdays. Her daughter even brought me cupcakes for my birthday last year. I remember my last visit with her before she went on hospice...she told me that she hoped to make it through the holidays so she could spend Christmas with her new great grandson. She loved that little guy so much.

She also told me once that her favorite hobby was to just climb on her Harley Davidson and ride away without any plans to go anywhere. She missed not being able to ride because she had to take an oxygen tank with her everywhere. She would get melancholy telling me how much she missed the freedom to just get on her motorcycle and ride and feel the air rush past her.

She spent her life as a respiratory therapist up until she retired. Later, in the irony that is life, she developed COPD and became one the patients like she used to care so much about. I found an article on KSL about her that detailed how much she loved her patients.

BOUNTIFUL -- Who says dreams don't come true? Not 26-year old Danny Salazar.

All his life, he wanted to ride on a motorcycle. However, because

he's a ventilator dependent quadriplegic, he knew it was something he could never do on his own.

When one of his caregivers at South Davis Community Hospital in Bountiful heard about his wish recently, she started making phone calls.

Within an hour, Doug and Julie Rice of West Jordan offered to make Salazar's wish come true.

The Rices have a motorcycle with an attached sidecar that has been retrofitted to be as handicap accessible as possible.

Friday morning, Salazar was helped into the sidecar, and they went for the ride of his life.

Salazar has been a patient at South Davis Community Hospital for 24 years and was accompanied on the ride with his respiratory therapist Zetta Michie.

Michie is the caregiver who arranged the ride.

They went about 20 miles from Bountiful to Farmington and back.

Even though the ride lasted less than an hour, staff members say Salazar's memory of this event will last a lifetime.

"It was awesome," said Salazar, "It was such a blast!"

I am so going to miss this special lady. Thank you for being there in my life no matter how short of time it was.
